Bratislava has an excellent location close to the borders of Austria, Hungary and the Czech Republic. Very good access from two international airports Bratislava airport (15 minutes drive) and Vienna airport (35 minutes drive along the motorway).

Within the European Union it can only be produced in Slovakia and is distributed under the name "Slovenská bryndza". Distinctive living folklore and traditions differing according to the regions. Folk art and ancient crafts.

Bratislava - the Gate to Slovakia

Capital of the Slovak Republic, Bratislava is situated in the triangle of the cities of Prague, Vienna and Budapest, and is accessible by plane, boat, train or car.

Bratislava is the political, economic and cultural centre of the country, the residence of the president, government, parliament, ministries and national government bodies, a university centre, the home of many museums (20), galleries (8), theatres and other institutions. Although Bratislava belongs among some of the youngest cities in Europe, the history of the city dates back to medieval times. In the past, it was the coronation city of the Hungarian kings. The city centre is a place where history breathes from the buildings and the picturesque streets are full of cafes, restaurants and bars where you can enjoy a glass of wine from the hillsides of the Low Carpathians.

Bratislava is a city of culture. In the past Beethoven, Mozart, Haydn, and List played concerts here. Currently, the city is alive with festivals and cultural events. It is a dynamically developing metropolis full of young people inspiring a city with a unique atmosphere.

Slovakia, with more than 1200 thermal and mineral springs, can offer a wide range of spas and wellness centres. 23 spa resorts located all over Slovakia offer healing procedures with thermal water, mud, wellness programmes, beautifying as well as weight loss, or active stays. The most important Slovak spas include Piešťany, Turčianske Teplice, Rajecké Teplice, Dudince and Bardejov. In the past, our spas were also visited by several famous people such as Ludwig van Beethoven, the Russian Tsar Alexander, the wife of Napoleon I and Empress Flisabeth of Austria (also called Sissy).








The Best of Slovakia





- The largest medieval castle complex in Central Europe Spiš Castle (40,000 m²).
- The most extensive underground facilities in Central Europe the cellars under the Red Stone Castle.
- Late Gothic wing altar with the largest collection of 48 window paintings on its wings in Europe main altar of St. Elisabeth in St. Elisabeth's Cathedral in Košice.



- Top Celtic oppidum in Central Europe from the second century. BC. Located on the Bratislava Castle Hill and encroaching on the territory of today's Old Town as far as Freedom Square.
- Largest wooden Gothic altar in the world the main altar by master Pavol in St. James's Church in Levoča.
- Oldest art memory statue of Venus (made from a mammoth tooth), 22,800 years old.
- The most extensive karst area in Central Europe Slovak Karst (440 km²).
- The largest ice cave in Slovakia and one of the largest in Europe the Dobšinská Ice Cave.
- The largest river island in Europe Rye Island (132,612 ha) lying between the Danube river and its left arm.
- The only aragonite cave in Europe the Ochtinská Aragonite Cave.
- The highest point in Slovakia Gerlachovský Peak in the High Tatras, with a height of 2655m above sea level
- The longest Slovak river River Vah.
- The highest waterfall in Slovakia Kmeťov waterfall (80m) in the High Tatras. Located in Koprova valley.
- The oldest mining university in Europe the Mining School in Banská Štiavnica (founded in 1735).
- The oldest university in the territory of Slovakia Academia Istropolitana in Bratislava (15th century),
- The oldest continuously operating manufacturing factory in Slovakia the Kremnica mint, founded in 1328. Also belongs among the longest active mints in Europe.
- Museum of Modern Art, Andy Warhol, Medzilaborce unique in Europe.
- The highest situated apartment in Central Europe apartment at the top of Lomnický Peak (2634m) in the High Tatras.
